

Paper rose tutorial

I'm sure there are lots of different ways to make these paper roses, but this is how I do it:

- 1) Items you will need:

circle punch
cardstock
ink
wet glue
paper piercer



- 2) Punch out a circle of cardstock using the 1 3/4" circle punch from Stampin' Up!



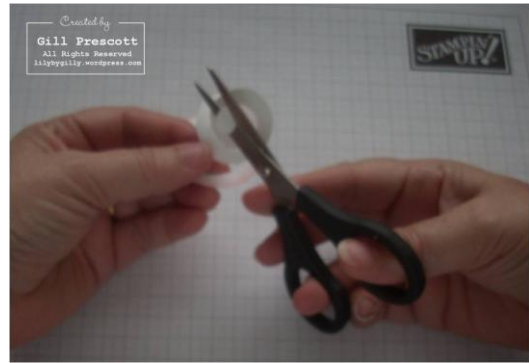
- 3) Sponge the edge with an ink colour of your choice. Here I used pink pirouette:



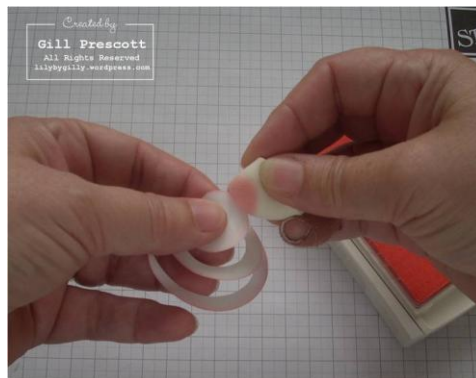
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- 4) Cut the circle into a spiral – Stampin’ Up!’s paper snips are brilliant for doing this:



- 5) Sponge the rest of the spiral edge, continuing on the same edge as you started earlier:



- 6) Use a paper piercer, or something similar, to wrap the card around, keeping it rolled quite tightly.



- 7) Release the coil of card – it should now hold its “rose” shape.



- 8) Add some strong glue, such as tombow mono multi-gue from Stampin’ Up!, to the centre of the spiral and press the rose down with the end of the paper piercer for a few seconds until the glue holds.



- 9) The finished rose...



And here are the roses on a finished card....



Of course you can make these roses in any colour you wish, and you can add punched paper leaves if desired. They would also look lovely with basic pearls added to the centre, or even edged with dazzling diamonds!

Your imagination is your only limit! Enjoy!
